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1 A call to action...

This handbook outlines the many volunteer opportunities available through Saint Frances Cabrini Parish. Whether you're interested in joining one of the many committees, helping out with an event, volunteering in the parish school, or doing community outreach, there is something for everyone. You are encouraged to look through the list of opportunities and listen to how God is calling you to make a difference in the lives of the members of our parish and in the larger West Bend community.

2 Finance and Administrative Service

2.1 Finance Council

Members work in partnership with the Pastoral Council to oversee the financial status and record keeping of the parish as well as the financial planning and capital fund raising. This is a closed committee and is staffed by Pastor-appointed parishioners (per Archdiocesan Norms). Below you will find the subcommittee opportunities for the Finance Council. Please contact the parish office for additional information.

2.2 Facilities: Building and Grounds Committee

Members work in partnership with Pastor and parish staff to oversee the repair, upkeep and improvement of the parish and school property as well as long range plans for improvement projects.

3 Pastoral Council

The Saint Frances Cabrini Pastoral Council has thirteen (13) members. The Saint Frances Cabrini Pastoral Council has the following *ex officio* members: Pastor and Associated Pastor (shared with Immaculate Conception Parish) and two (2) Saint Frances Cabrini Parish trustees. The Council has nine (9) at-large representatives selected from and by the membership of the parish.

Council meetings are held a minimum of six (6) times a year; the Immaculate Conception Pastoral Council meets jointly with the Saint Frances Cabrini Pastoral Council for one portion of each regular meeting (“common” or “shared time”). Each Council and its standing committees remain distinct entities, though they meet jointly; a portion of each regular meeting is also conducted with the councils and committees separated (“parish specific time”).

New members are chosen by a nomination process in the spring of each year and then participate in a discernment process to determine who will serve. The term for council members is three (3) years.

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4 School Advisory Committee

The purpose of the School Advisory Committee is to assist, develop and define the policies and budget which shall govern the operation of Saint Frances Cabrini Catholic School. The School Advisory Committee will support and promote the implementation of these policies. It shall also provide counsel and advice in the operation of the school, including matters that involve recruiting new families and promoting our school to the community at large. It shall be responsible for and provide policies under which administrative personnel (Pastor and Principal) shall operate the educational program of the parish school.

The School Advisory Committee shall consist of the following:

- One (1) Chairperson
- Seven (7) voting members – Five (5) parent/guardian, Two (2) parishioner/Catholic community member with no students in the school
- One (1) Pastoral Council liaison (Saint Frances Cabrini Catholic Parish) - ex-officio
- One (1) Finance Council liaison (Saint Frances Cabrini Catholic Parish) – ex-officio
- One (1) Principal - ex-officio
- One (1) Pastor - ex-officio

It is required that two-thirds of the elected members are parents of children attending Saint Frances Cabrini Catholic School. All School Advisory Committee members must be school parents/guardians, parishioners and/or catholic community members.

A School Advisory Committee member's term is for three (3) years. Members' terms are staggered so that there are two (2) openings each year. The School Advisory Committee shall have a representation or a liaison from the parish's Pastoral Council.

5 Stewardship

5.1 SFC Stewardship Committee

The Stewardship Committee is comprised of the Shared Pastoral Associate and sufficient at-large parish members. This committee meets 4-5 times a year. The Stewardship Committee helps to foster stewardship formation and evangelization through education and parish fellowship events. The committee may choose to meet more frequently if needed, in addition to the linked meetings with Immaculate Conception stewardship committee.

5.2 Parish Fellowship

This group is a sub-committee of the Stewardship Committee. The group consists of volunteers for the purpose of promoting parish-wide fellowship and evangelization events in an effort to build community. Events currently include: Faith and Family Fest, Fall Variety / Dinner show, Chili Supper, Pancake

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Breakfast, Donut Sundays, and the Mother Cabrini spaghetti dinner. No regularly scheduled meetings are required, just what is needed to plan for the events. Event leaders must be in communication with the Stewardship Committee for evaluation and coordination.

5.3 Rummage Sale

A team of volunteers coordinate the annual rummage sale held in the fall of the year. Duties included soliciting donations, organizing and prepping donations for sale along with helping at the sale.

6 CATHOLIC FORMATION and EVANGELIZATION

6.1 Catholic Formation and Evangelization Committee

The Catholic Formation and Evangelization Committee is comprised of the Catholic formation staff together with a sufficient number of at-large parish members, including one day-school parent. The group meets 4-6 times a year and helps evaluate and set mission priorities for campus wide formation programming. The programs target: Catechists, Helpers and Aides, School student faith formation, School teacher faith formation, Journey program, RCIA, Discipleship Small groups. See the descriptions below for more information.

6.2 Grade 4K-8 Catechists

This ministry fosters faith formation of children who are in grades 4K-8. Classes are held Sunday mornings. Class sizes average between 10-15 children. All materials are provided. Ongoing support is available through in-service training, teaching manuals, other teachers, etc. This is an excellent opportunity for personal faith development and a chance to work with children. This requires a monthly time commitment of 6-8 hours, September through May. The commitment time frame is 1 year.

6.3 Grade 4K-8 Classroom Aides

This ministry supports the catechist in classroom management, helping maintain order through the lesson, serve snacks (if applicable), facilitate arts and craft projects, etc. This requires a monthly time commitment of approximately five (5) hours, September through May. The commitment time frame is one school year. This is a great option for high school students looking for service hours.

6.4 Grade 4K-8 Hall Monitors

This ministry helps to assure the safety of the students, locking and unlocking doors, making phone calls to parents as necessary, and other tasks as needed.

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6.5 Journey – Special Religious Education for the Developmentally Disabled

This program is specifically designed to meet the spiritual needs of children, teenagers, and adults with developmental disabilities. The monthly time commitment is 4-5 hours, September through May. Sessions meet twice monthly. Commitment time frame is two (2) years. Volunteers must be 21 years of age or older. Training and on-going support is provided.

6.6 Summer Programming for Children (Vacation Bible School) Volunteers

Catholic Vacation Bible School (VBS) is offered during the summer to enrich the faith of children going into grades 5K - 12th. The 5K – 5th grade session meets in the mornings for 1 week, while grades 6-8 and 9-12 meet in the evenings. Volunteers are needed to help support and run these programs.

6.7 Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) Team Members and Leaders

RCIA is for adults interested in becoming Catholic; for people who were never baptized, who were baptized in other faith traditions or who were baptized Catholic, but not brought up in the Catholic faith. Volunteers are needed to assist with various aspects of this process. Guidance, resources, mentors and materials are provided to team members. This ministry seeks individuals who are willing to share time, faith and understanding of the Catholic religion. The time commitment is 2-3 hours a week. The group meets every Sunday morning and is on-going throughout the year.

6.8 FOCCUS Couples

The goal of this ministry is to assist couples planning to be married at Saint Frances Cabrini Parish. Couples who have a strong commitment to each other and the Catholic faith are needed. Guidance, resources, mentors and materials are provided to FOCCUS sponsors. The monthly time commitment is 4–8 hours. This group could meet anytime throughout the year.

6.9 Adult Leader for Catholic Youth Mission Trips

This ministry invites adults to work alongside teens in various service opportunities. Week-long trips involve a variety of jobs from construction to serving in a soup kitchen. Adults supervise and drive teens to various locations throughout the country. Preparation for the trip takes place from October through May. Trips take place during the summer months. Commitment time frame is typically one (1) year.

6.10 Catholic Youth Mission Trips

This ministry invites teens to work in various service opportunities. Week-long trips entail a variety of jobs from construction to servicing in a soup kitchen. Trips take place during the summer months. Commitment time frame is typically one (1) year.

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6.11 Adult Small Group Leaders for SFC-HD (High School) Catechism Classes

This ministry fosters faith formation among teens in grades 9-12. Training will be provided through support, in-service programs, manuals and staff guidance. This is an opportunity for personal faith development. Volunteers will share time with teens during Sunday afternoon classes. This ministry requires a semester long commitment of approximately 2.5 hours per week.

6.12 Young Adult Volunteers for SFC-HD (High School) Catechism Classes

This relational ministry fosters faith formation among teens in grades 9-12. Volunteers share time and build relationships with teens through service and socials events. This is an opportunity to act as a role model for teens while sharing and deepening one's own faith. Dates and times for youth events vary and are ongoing throughout the year. Commitment timeframe is flexible.

Are you able to commit to certain dates or times? This ministry is for you! Individuals are needed for special event help such as First Communion, First Reconciliation, Generations of Faith, etc. Volunteering could entail planning, setup, decoration, clean-up and other associated tasks. Time commitment varies. Commitment time frame is one (1) year.

6.14 Faith and Family Lifelong Formation Group

Join other families in faith filled, interactive fun! This twice a year special event is held for families at both Saint Frances Cabrini and Immaculate Conception parishes. Families share in music, learning, crafts and prayer. Individuals are needed for planning, set-up, decoration, directing craft projects and suggesting ideas to make these events fun filled. This group meets 2-4 times per year, September through May.

7 HUMAN CONCERNS

7.1 Human Concerns Core Committee

This committee is composed of Staff together with a sufficient number of at-large parish members, who meet four (4) times per year. The Human Concerns Core Committee has working links to various Human Concerns apostolates and the Core Committee may ask for at least one (1) annual meeting of the heads of all the apostolates. The Human Concerns Core Committee is also responsible for the Pastoral Care ministry evaluation.

7.2 Saint Vincent DePaul Meal Ministry

Volunteers participate six (6) times per year in this ministry. Duties include meal preparation at Saint Frances Cabrini on a Sunday morning along with transporting and serving the meal on Tuesday afternoons/evenings on the North side of Milwaukee (Martin Luther King Dr. at Center St.) Volunteers can choose to participate in just the meal prep, the serving of the meal or both.

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7.3 Food Pantry Ministry

Volunteers pick up donated food from the parish drop off locations in church and deliver to the Full Shelf Food Pantry in West Bend. Sharing Sunday, which is an opportunity for parishioners to bring food to the liturgy, is scheduled for the 4th Sunday of the month and these donations are also picked up and taken to the food pantry. The time commitment is 1 hour every 2-3 months.

7.4 St. James Harvest House

Saint Frances Cabrini volunteers through Saint James Episcopal Church offer a weekly Saturday lunch that is served free to anyone in need in West Bend. Saint Frances Cabrini assists in financing Harvest House along with other churches and individuals in the West Bend area.

7.5 Giving Tree

Volunteers setup and coordinate the Giving Tree providing an opportunity for Parishioners to give Christmas gifts to those in need in our community.

7.6 Respect Life

Volunteers coordinate parish wide Respect Life efforts. This program addresses human life issues from conception to natural death which includes abortion, assisted suicide, capital punishment, cloning, contraception, stem cell research and euthanasia.

7.7 Christ Child Society

Volunteers work with the Milwaukee chapter of the Christ Child Society helping children with the following services: providing layettes to needy newborns, providing “My Stuff Bag” to children removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect, monthly meetings with young mothers for support and education, being tutors and educational aides in elementary schools and providing scholarships.

Volunteers work in partnership with the St. Joseph Family Homes in Haiti to support three homes which minister to street children. The mission provides knowledge, spiritual and financial support and supplies to this organization in a truly loving manner.

Volunteers work to support the Family Promise and Interfaith Network to provide temporary shelter for local homeless families. Volunteers also provide meals and hospitality for the individuals during their week-long stay at Cabrini. Saint Frances Cabrini provides this support roughly four (4) times a year for one (1) week at a time.

8 PASTORAL CARE – a sub group of Human Concerns

Pastoral Care Ministers offer an awareness of God’s presence by visiting parishioners who are homebound, in assisted living or nursing home facilities. They also take Holy Communion to all hospitalized Catholics at St. Joseph’s Hospital, Cedar Crossings Sub-Acute facility and Kathy Hospice. These dedicated volunteers work in collaboration with the ordained priests and deacons of the area, helping to lighten their work load and making sure that all who request care and support can be ministered to in a timely fashion.

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8.1 Pastoral Care Committee

Pastoral Care Ministry leaders meet as necessary. Duties are to recruit, train, provide continuing formation and support all the ministries listed below. This committee is co-chaired by Pastoral Care ministers and a staff member.

8.2 Hospital Communion Distributor

Bring Communion to all Catholic patients at St. Joseph’s Hospital, Cedar Crossings Sub-Acute Facility, and Kathy Hospice. This is a multi-parish ministry with Saint Frances Cabrini, Immaculate Conception, Saint Peters and Holy Angels. Volunteers will receive one-on-one training with opportunities for additional formation sessions. Ministers are asked to do one day a month requiring approximately 2 hours of time in order to bring Jesus’ healing presence to those in need.

8.3 Assisted Living or Nursing Home Visitor and Communion Distributor

Visit and bring Communion on a regular basis to Catholic residents of the various healthcare or assisted living facilities in West Bend and the surrounding area. Volunteers will receive one-on-one training along with opportunities for additional formation sessions. Time commitment depends on the number of residents each pastoral care minister is assigned, but is usually 2 to 3 hours per month.

8.4 Homebound Visitor and Communion Distributor

Visit and bring Communion on a regular basis to one or several homebound parishioners. Volunteers will receive one-on-one training along with opportunities for additional formation sessions. More time is usually spent in the home for a more personal setting. Time varies from 30 minutes to 1 hour per home.

8.5 Senior Adult Ministry Trips

Help plan and organize trips and social events for senior adults. Time commitment varies by event. This is a Quad Parish program.

Provide support and prayer to grieving families through phone contact, personal visits, mailing of grief literature. Time commitment varies. An Ecumenical support group is offered the first Thursday of each month.

8.7 Prayer Shawl Ministry

Volunteers knit and crochet shawls for anyone undergoing or recovering from medical procedures; as a comfort after a loss, during bereavement or an illness and the recovery of that illness. Shawls are a comfort to anyone in need of physical, spiritual or emotional comfort. Work can be done as a group or individually. Prayers are said before and while knitting. Shawls are blessed upon completion. Shawl makers donate their time and yarn. Donations are accepted for supplies. (3 hours per month)

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9 PRAYER AND WORSHIP

9.1 Prayer and Worship

“Using the gifts through prayer and worship to expand our faith in our everyday lives.” The Prayer and Worship Committee works to nourish and give direction to the liturgical aspects of parish life. There are many ministry opportunities for involvement including: the Prayer and Worship committee, Art and Environment group, ministers of hospitality (greeters and ushers), lectors, adult mass servers, student mass servers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, technology assistants, sacristans, maintaining altar linens, church cleaning, and musicians. The Parish has a children’s choir, Resurrection choir, and Sunday Mass choir, as well as a contemporary ensemble. New choir members are always welcome and one may audition for roles as accompanists, cantors and instrumentalists.

Administrative tasks under this committee include: liturgy office volunteers, music librarians, coordinators for ushers, sacristans, altar linens, church cleaning, art and environment, and assistance processing audio visual materials along with other duties required by the Director of Liturgy and Music.

9.2 Music Ministries

There are a multitude of ways to share your gift of music. New choir members are always welcome. The Sunday Mass choir is open to high school students and adults. They practice at 8:30 a.m. during the academic year and sing for the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass and at Christmas, Triduum and Holy Day Liturgies. The Resurrection Choir sings a basic repertoire of hymns for parish funerals. Members are contacted via phone tree and practice approximately one-half hour before a funeral. This group is very fluid and flexible, so it may be a wonderful way for the person with a busy schedule to get involved in music. The Children’s Choir rehearses after school and sings for Masses and parish events throughout the year. Another group of adult and student musicians play for the 6:00 p.m. liturgy using keyboards, guitars and percussion. They practice an hour before the Mass. Those who are interested in serving as cantors, accompanists and instrumentalists may audition for these roles.

9.3 Art and Environment

These volunteers create the rich and beautiful worship space here at Saint Frances Cabrini, combining their artistic skills with good liturgical theology to enhance the worship of the entire parish by crafting settings that are both liturgically functional and aesthetically pleasing. Constructing liturgical environments requires a subtle hand and a keen eye. Those who are skilled in sewing, arranging flowers, and decorating may enjoy this ministry, but we also need individuals who can lift, climb ladders, and assist with minor carpentry skills. This is a wonderful area for a couple to be involved in together.

9.4 Ministers of Hospitality
